IF THIS HAPPENS	DO THIS
<b>Tanker/Vehicle Accident</b>	Switch off engine and electrical equipment. Keep people away, warn other traffic. Check for spills, leaks. <b>Call the emergency services: Dial 111</b>
<b>Spill or leak</b>	Use appropriate protective equipment. Spills may be slippery and should be cleaned up immediately. Dike and pump as much as possible into a salvage container. Absorb the remaining liquid and any small spills with clay granules, sand, or other absorbent material and sweep into a waste container. Minimise run-off into drains or waterways.
<b>Fire</b>	<b>Call the Fire Service: Dial 111.</b> Vapours may be toxic. Self-contained breathing apparatus required; chemical suit recommended. Addition of water may cause excessive foaming. Do not allow contaminated run-off to enter drains or waterways.

<b>If swallowed</b>	If swallowed, rinse mouth with water, DO NOT induce vomiting. Seek medical advice.
<b>If in eyes</b>	Immediately flush eyes with flowing water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
<b>If on skin</b>	Immediately flush with plenty of water while removing contaminated clothing. DO NOT scrub the skin. Continue for at least 15 minutes.
<b>If inhaled</b>	Remove victim to fresh air. Apply resuscitation if victim is not breathing. <b>Do not use direct mouth-to-mouth method if victim has ingested or inhaled the product</b> , use alternative method or respiratory device. Administer oxygen if breathing is difficult.
